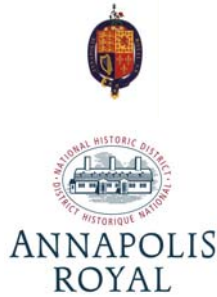
Clear Bag Program

Commencing April 1, 2008



black/green bags will no longer be collected. Individuals who continue to use them will have their bag(s) left at curbside to be emptied into a clear bag for the next collection. Clear bags which contain organic materials, recyclables or other provincially banned materials will also be left curbside to be resorted for the next collection day.

For privacy issues, garbage collected in clear bags will allow for one solid color bag per clear bag, no larger than 20" by 22" (kitchen catcher size) that may contain bathroom waste and/or health related items that residents do not wish to be visible. All other waste must be visible within the clear bag.

- All plastic rigid containers are recyclable. Put it in your blue bag with milk cartons, metal and glass.
- Metal lids are recyclable, just tuck them inside the container they came from.
- If wreaths do not contain wires or plastics they can go in your green cart.
- Last year the Valley area sent more than 82,000 tires for recycling!

Clear Bag Program

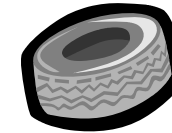
Effective April 1, 2008

The Town of Annapolis Royal will implement a "new" Clear Bag Program. Effective April 1, 2008 all residents are requested to place items currently disposed in black/green bags into a clear bag for collection by EFR.

Residents are encouraged to begin the process now to allow time for questions, clarification and uncertainties.



Paint cans that still have paint in them can be returned to the local Enviro-Depot. Empty paint cans, with the lid off go in your clear bag.



Return your used car and truck tires (up to four at a time) to any tire retailer in the province.



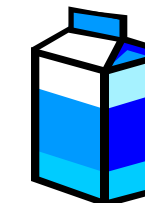
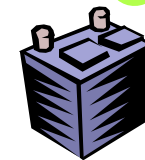
Oil retailers are required to accept used oil for recycling.



Styrofoam is not recyclable. Meat trays, cups, plates and packaging materials go in your clear garbage bag.



Batteries are considered hazardous waste and are accepted, free of charge, at the Management Centre in Lawrencetown. Rechargeable batteries are often accepted at retail outlets where they are sold.



Rinse milk cartons and put them in your blue recycling bag with plastic, metal and glass.
