The Town of Annapolis Royal is honored to be the recipient of the 2006 Prince of Wales Prize. The Heritage Society had nominated the Town and Mayor John Kinsella will be presented with the award at a ceremony in Ottawa on October 13th. The prize is awarded annually to a municipal government which has shown exemplary commitment to heritage preservation within its jurisdiction. The award consists of a bronzed plaque, a scroll and a pennant.
