Annapolis Royal Historic Gardens Receives International Honours

Annapolis Royal, NS - Friday the 13th was not an unlucky day in any way for the Annapolis Royal Historic Gardens, who were recognized as one of the "5 North American Gardens Worth Traveling For". The Historic Gardens were honoured on April 13 at the Annual Canadian and International Garden Tourism Awards in Vancouver, BC. The Garden Tourism Awards are presented to organizations and individuals who have distinguished themselves in the development and promotion of the garden experience as a tourism attraction. In the award notification, Michel Gauthier, Manager for the Canadian Garden Tourism Council writes, "It is a well-deserved acknowledgement of the quality of experience offered by Annapolis Royal Historic Gardens to tourists traveling for a garden experience and your leadership in the development of Garden Tourism in Canada."

Town Hall will be closed May 21st for Victoria Day. For Public Works Emergencies, please call 532-8347.

However, you will also be aware that the Town has lost over 30% of its revenues as a result of the re-evaluation of the tidal power station for a total of \$633,450.00. Meanwhile, transit ridership at this end of the County has been disappointing, largely due to the loss of Shaw Wood and Convergys. If the Town were to continue to participate in public transit with the new service provider, Trans County Transportation Society (TCTS), we would be facing \$19,000 in operational costs and \$10,500 for the Town's share of a new bus. We simply do not have the money to do this. As a result, your Town Council has made the difficult decision to pull out of public transit, until such time as our financial situation substantially improves. We regret the loss of this valued service, but hope that the public will understand that hard choices have to be made, and this is one of many.

Next Three Water Projects

Work is to start on the Town's next three water projects on May 15 and end on June 12, 2012. The three projects include: disconnection and abandonment of the St George Street watermain between St Patrick's Lane and the water tower in Lequille, replacement of the watermain between Ritchie Street and Prince Albert Street, and replacement of the watermain and street upgrade on part of Victoria Street. Tim Ward will be the site foreman and he can be reached at 825-8127 with any questions. Construction will not take place before 7:00 am and not before 9:00 am on Sundays or holidays, and not after 9:30 pm or 7:00 pm on Sundays or holidays in accordance with the Town's Orderly and Peaceful Conduct By-law.

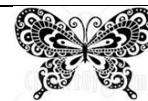

Tree News May 2012

It's May, the grass is green...we are about a month ahead of other years. My youngest son was born on May 5th and I almost called him dandelion. I was inside for 3 days focussed on the little newborn and came out to a field of green and yellow (I guess the lawn needed mowing). So every year when he sees the first dandelions, he gets excited about his birthday. Spring in Annapolis Royal also means magnolia blossoms. The white and pink star magnolias on the courthouse lawn started blooming the second week in April. That is the earliest I have seen them in bloom. But it's not over yet, they are followed by the saucer magnolias, the "little girls"- magnolias, the "galaxies" on Chapel Street and the different yellows and other specialties. They are blooming all over town and the Historic Gardens have a great selection of magnolias. A self guide is available at the Historic Gardens office if you want to go on a magnolia walk. And mark your calendar for the 5th annual "Annapolis Royal Celebrates Magnolias" May 12th and 13th. Please see attached schedule.

I mentioned last month that Annapolis Royal is receiving 125 trees from the TD bank this year. They have set the budget for those trees quite low, so I suggested we would plant fewer trees but larger (so our deer population can't reach them). TD staff will spend a day in Town in September and plant these trees. Thank you, TD Bank. There will be red maple, sugar maple, white ash, possibly red oak and different nut trees.

We received enough funding now to establish the Community Garden and Orchard beside the Legion. I am working on getting the basic structure established with the fence and the bed boxes and some landscaping. Once that work is done we are going to invite the community and have a launch (that's when the fun begins). In connection with the community garden, we received funding for "edible trees" in town. Some of those trees will also go to other sites in town. I would appreciate any information on sources of nut trees or special other fruit trees (like heritage apples). Exciting times for tree planting: imagine going for a walk 50 years from now?

Due to budget cuts in Town, the maintenance budget for trees is very slim this year. It made me feel quite worried because I would like to see all the trees do well and be taken care of. I thought we could give young trees up for adoption.

Adopting a tree requires:

- occasional visits to the trees
- pulling out weeds around the tree circle
- mulching would be great (bark, leaves, sawdust, anything that will keep the roots healthy and cool)
- talking to the tree and occasional hugs

Reward:

- getting to know trees
- learning about tree maintenance
- great opportunity for families with children to develop a connection with nature
- destination for a walk

Let me know if you are interested; it takes a community to raise a tree. The seeds we plant today will make the forest of tomorrow.

Spring Clean-up 2012 will be May 8, 2012. Items may be placed curbside May 4, 2012.

WHAT GOES

WHAT DOESN'T

- ◆ washer, dryer, stove
- ◆ fridge, freezer, air conditioner, dehumidifier – with CFC sticker
- ◆ furniture, mattress
- ◆ water tank, boiler
- ◆ carpet (rolled in 4ft lengths)
- ◆ construction waste (tied securely in bundles)
- ◆ pine needles (in clear bags)
- ◆ small auto parts (no fuel or fluids)
- ◆ empty oil storage tank

- ◆ NEW Electronics: televisions, computers, monitors, printers, audio & visual playback and recording systems, telephones etc.
- ◆ leaves and brush
- ◆ cardboard boxes
- ◆ large or heavy auto parts
- ◆ household hazardous waste, paint & motor oil
- ◆ propane cylinders
- ◆ automotive tires
- ◆ automotive batteries
- ◆ fridge, freezer, air conditioner, dehumidifier – without CFC sticker

- ◆ No more than **20 items** will be collected from any one stop. An item is a single object, a bag or a securely tied bundle measuring no more than 1.2 metres in length.
- ◆ Bagged garbage must be in clear transparent bags
- ◆ No more than 2 of any one appliance type (e.g. fridge, stove, water tank, etc.) will be collected at any one stop.
- ◆ Items not collected during Clean-up are the responsibility of the resident and must be removed from roadside when the clean-up is finished.
- ◆ Lumber or loose items must be bagged or tied securely in bundles no longer than 1.2 metres (4 feet). Nails should be bent over or removed for safety reasons.
- ◆ Any one furniture or appliance item must weigh no more than 91kgs (200 lbs.) other items must weigh no more than 34 kgs (75 lbs.).
- ◆ Fridges, freezers and air conditioners cannot be collected until CFC's have been removed and a sticker applied to the unit. The Western Management Centre at 343 Elliot Road near Lawrencetown at Exit 19 on Highway 101 will accept and service refrigeration units for a \$20 fee.

Needles and lancets are a safety hazard to the garbage collectors and all who handle waste. For this reason they must be kept out of garbage and recycling bags. Here are two options for disposal of needles.

- Diabetic needles have a special disposal in Nova Scotia. Your local pharmacy will provide you with a free plastic container to save your needles in. When full, drop off the container at your pharmacy.
- Non-diabetic needles (ex. veterinarian needles) can be brought for **free** to the Valley Waste Management Centre in Kentville or Lawrencetown. They must be in a hard plastic container with a tight fitting lid and labeled "Needles" or "Sharps".
